A study to find how energy drinks interact with bacteria in your colon (ROSANNA)

We are looking for healthy volunteers between the ages of 18 and 40 to help researchers at the University of Florida Health Cancer Center understand the potential link between energy drinks and an increased risk of colorectal cancer.

Volunteers will be asked to:

- Commit to entering daily, online journal entries for 5 weeks on their diet, fitness, and wellness.
- Collect and submit microbiota samples (mouth swabs, skin swabs, urine sample, stool sample) and a blood sample, at three different time points.
- Adhere to other protocol requirements.

Participants may receive:

- Up to \$195 in compensation.

Are you eligible?

- Adults 18-40 years of age.
- Consume no more than 2 energy drinks a week.
- Not pregnant
- No personal history of colorectal cancer or inflammatory bowel disease.
- No chronic diarrhea or chronic gastrointestinal problems.
- No oral or IV antibiotic use within the past 28 days (before beginning the study).
